

Checklist:

Flyer:

Develop script on what to say:

- Have a 1-minute spiel ready on who you are and why you're the best person for the job.
- Intro: "Hi, I'm _____m running for Committeeman/woman."
- Reason why: I think I can do a better job than the present incumbent who's been there for a long time."
- Question: "Have you ever met your Committeeman/woman?"
- Ask for their vote

SMILE: Be enthusiastic and polite.

Volunteers:

- Get at least 2 or 3 family members and friends or neighbors
- Go out in teams to campaign in your precinct.
- On Election Day, have them stand with you to hand out flyers, or to get to other voters if you are already speaking to one

Door-to-door:

- Don't go inside homes
- Don't argue positions
- Avoid controversial issues
- Ask people to come out to vote for you on Election Day

The Big Day:

- Get there early
- Position yourself and table advantageously, but don't stay behind the table and wait for the voters to come by. Walk up to them as they approach.
SMILE
- Put up large sign at table with your name and a few words which can tell voters about what you stand for, or have your volunteers hold signs.
- Don't engage in too much talk with voters at polls
- Don't engage in arguments over politics with voters
- Don't chit-chat with volunteers and miss approaching voters
- Have a small business-card sign with your name and/or picture on it to hand out to each voter
- If they decline to talk or ignore you, simply say: Thanks for coming out to vote.
